YOCHAY NADAN, Social Worker, Licensed Couple and Family Therapist and Supervisor, and a researcher. He is a Visiting Professor at the Division of Social and Transcultural Psychiatry, Department of Psychiatry, McGill University, and a Senior Lecturer at the Paul Baerwald School of Social Work and Social Welfare at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Risk, well-being and protection of children are socially formed concepts that depend largely on the contexts in which children and families live. This field however, is still largely rooted in “universal” assumptions and developmental theories that were formulated primarily in the West. In this presentation, Dr. Nadan will share his insights from a five year, large-scale research project exploring perceptions and constructions of child risk, well-being and protection in diverse communities and contexts in Israel. He will deconstruct and challenge some of these “universal” assumptions when working with minority groups. Examples regarding risk assessment and context-informed child-protection interventions based on work done with the Ultra-Orthodox community, the Ethiopian community and the Arab-Bedouin community in Israel, will be presented and discussed.
